EDUCATIONAL AND CAREER EXPERIENCES

Professor Tajiri is currently Professor in the Department of Innovative Interventional Endoscopy Research at the Jikei University School of Medicine, Tokyo, Japan.

He graduated from Hokkaido University School of Medicine in Sapporo, Japan, in 1976, and received postgraduate professional training at the Department of Internal Medicine at Cancer Institute Hospital and the Endoscopy Division at National Cancer Center Hospital in Tokyo. In 1995, he joined National Cancer Center Hospital East as the Chief of the Endoscopy Division.

Professor Tajiri's specialty and research interests are gastrointestinal endoscopy, as well as biliary and pancreatic diseases. His recent achievements are developments of various new endoscopic diagnosis and treatment for the GI malignancies using narrow band imaging (NBI) system, magnifying endoscopy, microscopic endoscopy such as endocytoscopy and confocal endomicroscopy, endoscopic submucosal dissection (ESD) and robotic assisted endoluminal surgery.

He has been in the position of a President of Japan Gastroenterological Endoscopy Society (JGES) since May, 2013. In addition, he has been active as a Chair of Upper GI Cancer Committee of WEO, Vice President of Asian Pacific Society for Digestive Endoscopy (APSDE) and a Chair of Japan NOTES.

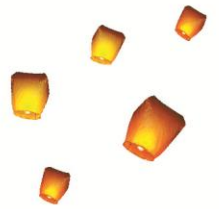
PUBLICATION
